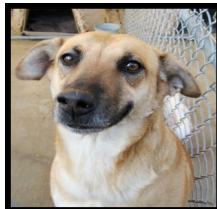
End Pet Overpopulation

Who? PAWS of NE Louisiana wants to see the pet overpopulation tragedy in our community come to an end. We will no longer accept euthanasia as an acceptable method of population control!

What? A low-cost, high-volume, high-quality spay/neuter facility will be operated and will target low income caretakers as well as shelter & rescue animals and feral cat populations.

When? Provided the necessary funding can be raised, the proposed facility opening will be in the Fall of 2010.

Where? The facility will be located in Ouachita parish.

was formed by PAWS of NE Louisiana in July 2009 to further address companion animal overpopulation in Northeast Louisiana. After operating a low income spay/neuter voucher program for 6 years, the number of dogs and cats being euthanized in our area is still at an unacceptable level.

Although efforts are made to rescue and adopt as many animals as possible, it is very clear that we will not adopt our way out of this epidemic. PAWS believes that the most effective non-lethal method to reduce overpopulation is by spaying and neutering.

Our goal is to open a high-volume, high-quality low-cost spay/neuter facility



dedicated to performing surgery full-time. We will plan, develop and implement a facility based on the Humane Alliance National Spay/Neuter Response Team (NSNRT) model. The NSNRT's mission is to assist animal welfare organizations in the implementation of high-quality,



high-volume spay/neuter facilities nationwide.

This model allows for the NSNRT staff to provide training, mentoring and support to our staff. The facility will perform 25-35 surgeries a day, 5 days a week. This facility will be a spay/neuter only facility and fees for services will be affordable.
